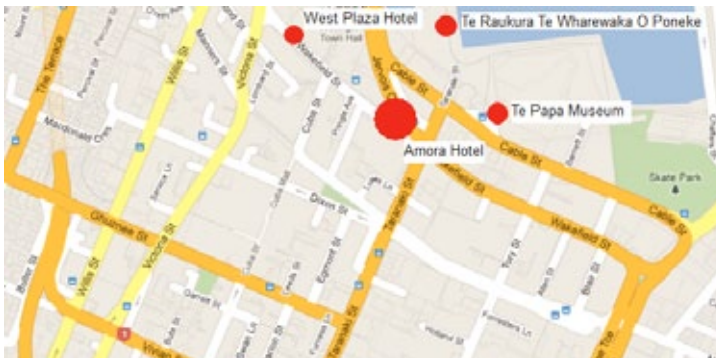

## CALL FOR ABSTRACTS

Submissions are invited for oral presentations in free communications sessions at the meeting. Abstracts should be no more than 250 words and be submitted no later than the 31st January, 2013.

Papers submitted by authors considered to be early career investigators will be considered for the \$1,000 President's Prize, which is awarded at the discretion of the President. As far as possible, the data presented in the abstract should not have been published or presented at another major meeting. If previously presented, the author(s) must indicate where and when the data has been reported. All abstracts will be subjected to peer review by specialists in the field.

It is a condition of submission that the presenting author of the abstract must register their attendance and pay the registration fee by the Early bird Registration deadline of 4th March 2013. We regret that abstracts will be excluded from the program and abstract publication if your registration is not received by this date.

## INVITED SPEAKERS



### **PROFESSOR THOMAS C. WRIGHT, JR., MD (USA)**

*Special Lecturer in Pathology and Cell Biology, Columbia University Medical Center New York, NY.*

For the last 15 years Dr Wright served as the Director of the Division of Gynecologic, Perinatal, and Cytologic Pathology at Columbia University Medical Center and also headed the colposcopy services at New York Presbyterian Hospital. He is the Past President of the American Society of Colposcopy and Cervical Pathology. He is a recipient of Distinguished Service Award from the American Society of Colposcopy and Cervical Pathology in 2002 and a Lifetime Career Award from the ASCCP in 2008. He is the lead author of both the 2001 and 2006 Consensus Guidelines Managing Women with Cytological Abnormalities, recommendations that have set the standard for evaluating women with abnormal Pap tests and treating cervical preinvasive disease in the United States.



### **DR CHARLES REDMAN (UK)**

*Consultant Gynaecologist, University Hospital of North Staffordshire*

Qualified at the Victoria University of Manchester in 1978 and largely trained in West Midlands. Was the Birmingham University CRC Gynaecological Cancer research fellow 1984-86. Appointed as Senior Lecturer in Obstetrics and Gynaecology at University Hospital of North Staffordshire in 1989. Research interests include cervical pre-cancer and ovarian cancer.



### **DR KAREN CHAN (HK)**

Dr Chan is a gynaecological oncologist at the Department of O&G, Queen Mary Hospital, Hong Kong. She is a clinical associate professor and an assistant dean (education) in the LKS Faculty of Medicine, University of Hong Kong. She is the vice president of the Hong Kong Society of Colposcopy and Cervical Pathology and a council member of the Hong Kong College of Obstetricians and Gynaecologists. She is also a board member of Asia-oceanic organization in genital infection and neoplasia ( AOGIN ).



### **PROFESSOR IAN FRAZER (AUST)**

Professor Frazer's current research interests include immunoregulation and immunotherapeutic vaccines for papillomavirus associated cancers. He trained as a renal physician and clinical immunologist in Edinburgh, Scotland before emigrating to Australia in 1980. He currently works in Brisbane at the University of Queensland and he now holds a personal chair as head of the Diamantina Institute. He is a creator of the HPV vaccine against cervical cancer. He won the 2005 CSIRO Eureka Prize for Leadership in Science and the Prime Minister's Prize for Science in 2008. Ian was also Australian of the Year in 2006.



### **PROFESSOR RON JONES (NZ)**

Ron has recently retired as a Consultant at the National Women's Hospital in Auckland. His interests include the natural history of lower genital tract neoplasia. He is a Past President of the International Society for the Study of Vulvovaginal Disease & a Past Chairman of the Scientific Committee of the International Federation of Cervical Pathology and Colposcopy.



### **PROFESSOR IAN HAMMOND (AUST)**

Ian Hammond is a Gynaecologic Oncologist and Clinical Professor in the School of Women's & Infants' Health, University of Western Australia. He was involved in the development of the Anatomy of Complications Workshop that is now in its 13th year. Ian chaired the Group responsible for the 2005 NHMRC endorsed Australian guidelines for the management of screen detected Pap smear abnormalities. He is currently the Chair of the Renewal Steering Committee for the Australian National Cervical Screening Program and this is a work in progress. Ian retired from clinical practice in 2012.

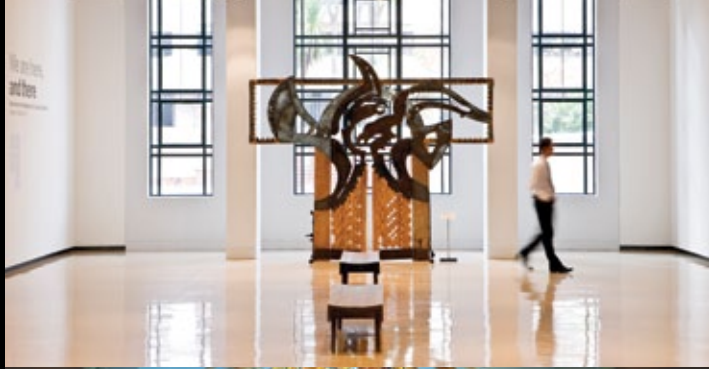
